

Turnout

- Turnout at the 2017 General Election was 66.8%; higher than the previous four General Elections.
- Across EU 28 countries, average turnout at the last parliamentary election was 66.1%.
- UK turnout at the 2014 European Parliament election was 35.4%. This was up on the 34.5% in 2009 but below the 38.5% in 2004.

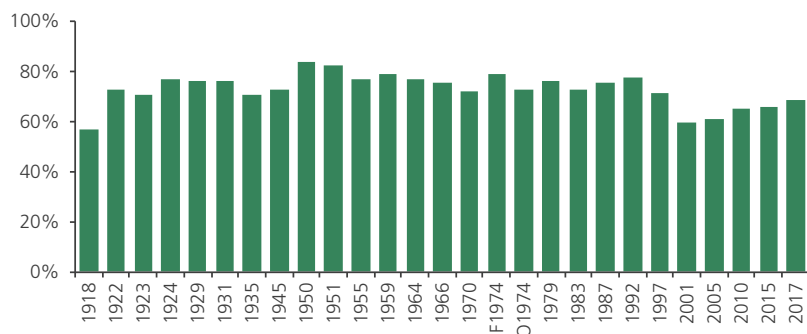

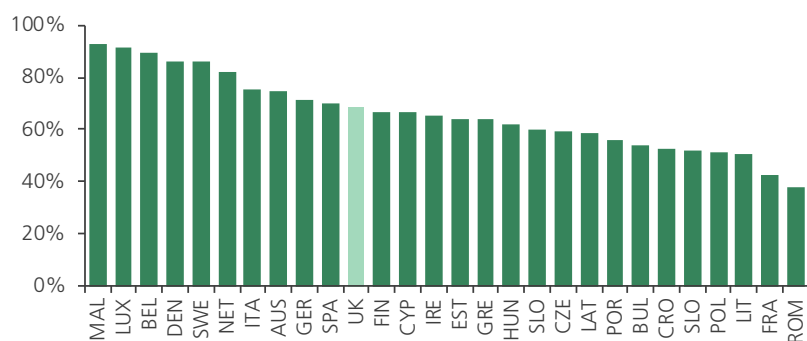
