# Trade agreements: a reading list

## 1. Summary

The UK Government has started negotiations for trade agreements with the US, Australia and New Zealand. It also intends to pursue accession to the Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP).

On 11 September 2020 the Government reached 'an agreement in principle' with Japan – an important step towards the conclusion of the UK-Japan Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement.<sup>1</sup>

On 23 October 2020 the Government and Japan signed the UK-Japan Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA).<sup>2</sup>

This reading list brings together a selection of statements from the UK Government and the other parties to these negotiations. It also includes material from Select Committees, press articles and other commentary.
