Wreck of the SS Richard Montgomery: Mitigating Risks QSD on 3 July 2019

Written answer in which the Government states that the Department for Transport (DfT) is responsible for the long-term management of the wreck, working closely with the Ministry of Defence and the Maritime and Coastguard Agency (MCA). The Government described this as a key priority for the DfT and that regular surveys of the wreck are carried out by the MCA.

Maritime and Coastguard Agency, <u>SS Richard Montgomery</u>, 4 January 2016

Background information on the SS Richard Montgomery including details on protection, surveys and management of the wreck. The US ship was wrecked in the Thames Estuary, near Sheerness, in August 1944, with approximately 1,400 tons of live explosives on board. The wreck is monitored but "the risk of a major explosion is believed to be remote".

Maritime and Coastguard Agency, <u>SS Richard Montgomery Survey Report 2017</u>, January 2019

Latest survey report of the SS Richard Montgomery commissioned by the MCA. The report outlines the outcome of surveys of the wreck undertaken in November 2017 and April 2018. The survey suggested that the wreck was stable overall, with any structural changes being restricted to discrete regions. The report stated that environmental monitoring equipment would be placed on the seabed for a period of twelve months, with results expected in late 2019.
