## Summary

This Research Paper presents a range of statistics relating to parliamentary questions, debate contributions, and Members' participation in Commons divisions during the Session of 2001-02 (13 June 2001 to 7 November 2002). It is based on information appearing in *Hansard* as recorded in POLIS (the Parliamentary On-Line Information Service) and the Library's divisions database. Further summary information on the business of the House of Commons during the Session is available from the Sessional Return.<sup>1</sup>

Detailed guidance notes are provided in **Part I** of this paper.

**Part II** considers the costs associated with answering parliamentary questions, and presents data relating to oral and written parliamentary questions by answering department. An analysis of parliamentary questions and debate contributions by party is also provided.

**Part III** presents data for individual Members of Parliament, including oral (substantive and supplementary) and written questions, debate contributions in the Commons Chamber and Westminster Hall, and Members' participation rates in Commons divisions for the Session.

The key summary statistics for the 2001-02 Session are:

- 73,995 oral and written questions answered
- 6,392 oral parliamentary questions answered, including 966 oral questions to the Prime Minister, comprising
  - 2,202 substantive oral questions
  - 4,190 supplementary oral questions
- 67,603 written parliamentary questions answered
- 11,924 debate contributions in the Commons Chamber
- 2,881 debate contributions in Westminster Hall
- 361 divisions (of which 13 were deferred divisions)

Members each made an average of 23 debate contributions in the Chamber and Westminster Hall, received answers to 103 written parliamentary questions, and asked 10 (substantive and supplementary) oral questions.

## I Guidance Notes

This Research Paper examines statistics relating to parliamentary questions and debate contributions in the House of Commons, as well as Members' participation in Commons divisions during the Session 2001-02, covering the period from 13 June 2001 to 7 November 2002. The principal analysis is for individual Members of Parliament, although aggregate data for parliamentary questions by party of allegiance and answering department are also included.

In the case of parliamentary questions and debate contributions, the data are derived from the House of Commons Library's *POLIS* database. The data on participation in Commons divisions are derived from uncorrected daily *Hansard*. The form of Members' names used in the tables is identical to that used in the *Official Report* (*Hansard*).

*POLIS* (Parliamentary On-line Indexing Service) is a collection of databases containing name- and subject-indexed references relating to current and recent Parliamentary information (including parliamentary questions, proceedings, parliamentary papers and legislation) and House of Commons Library collections.

### A. General

The number of questions tabled and contributions made by an individual Member, as well as their participation rate in Commons divisions, may be affected by several factors. These may include:

- holding office as a Government minister or Opposition spokesperson
- holding positions as a Government or Opposition Whip
- absence from Westminster on parliamentary or constituency business, including membership of delegations to international organisations.
- absence through period(s) of illness, bereavement, or paternity/maternity leave
- chairing a Standing Committee

Other factors affecting Members' participation rates in Commons divisions are noted in Section D below.

Readers are also advised to note the following points:

#### 1. Speaker and Deputies

The Speaker (Rt. Hon. Michael Martin MP) and the three Deputy Speakers (Rt. Hon. Sir Alan Haselhurst MP, Sylvia Heal MP and Michael Lord MP) do not normally table parliamentary questions, make contributions from the floor of the House or in Westminster Hall, or participate in Commons divisions. Their names are excluded from the relevant tables.

## 2. Death of Members of Parliament and by-elections held during the Session

Two Members of Parliament died during the 2001-02 Session. Their names are included in the relevant tables, but are italicised:

- Jamie Cann (Labour, Ipswich), until 15 October 2001
- Sir Raymond Powell (Labour, Ogmore), until 7 December 2001

Data relating to newly-elected Members refer to the period since the date of their introduction to the House. **Chris Mole** was elected for Ipswich at a by-election on 22 November 2001 and introduced to the House on 27 November 2001. **Huw Irranca-Davies** was elected for Ogmore at a by-election on 14 February 2002 and introduced on 28 February 2002. Their names are also italicised in the tables.

## 3. Changes of Party Allegiance

**Paul Marsden**, Member for Shrewsbury and Atcham, changed his party allegiance from Labour to Liberal Democrat with effect from 10 December 2001. **Andrew Hunter**, Member for Basingstoke, changed his party allegiance from Conservative to Independent Conservative with effect from 2 October 2002. The tables in Part III report party allegiance at the end of the Session.

## 4. Front-bench responsibilities

Members of Parliament who held Government ministerial office (including as whips) at any point during the Session and, likewise, members of the Conservative and Liberal Democrat Shadow Cabinets during this period, are shown in the tables with the following marks:

- ^ Cabinet/junior Minister, or Government whip
- \* Conservative Shadow Cabinet member
- \*\* Liberal Democrat Shadow Cabinet member

## B. Parliamentary Questions

Data relate to questions appearing in *Hansard* and represent questions answered rather than questions tabled. A question that appeared on the Order Paper but, for whatever reason, not printed with an answer in *Hansard* will not be included in the following tables. *POLIS* indexing conventions mean that where several questions from the same Member are answered together by a Minister, those questions are treated as a single

question. Further information relating to Parliamentary Questions is contained in House of Commons Information Office Factsheet P1, also available on-line.<sup>2</sup>

### **1. Supplementary Oral Questions**

Where a Member asks an oral question (OPQ) and is immediately given the opportunity by the Speaker (or a deputy) to put a single supplementary question, only one *POLIS* record will have been created. Any subsequent supplementaries, either from the Member asking the substantive question or from any other Member, will appear as separate *POLIS* records.

In the tables in Part III of this paper, the column marked “OPQ substantive” includes data for Members’ substantive oral questions and their first supplementary question only. The column marked “OPQ supplementary” includes data for Members’ second and subsequent supplementary questions, *and* all supplementary oral questions put by other Members.

### **2. Written Questions**

Written Parliamentary Questions (WPQs) data include ‘failed orals’. These are parliamentary questions which appear on the Order Paper as oral questions but are not answered in the Chamber and subsequently printed with a written answer in *Hansard*. WPQs taking the form of texts of answers from Executive Agencies have been included under the relevant answering department in the tables contained in Part II of this paper. Occasionally, additional written answers are printed in *Hansard* Bound Volumes which have not previously been printed in the *Hansard* Daily Part. These may not be included in the WPQ data reported here.

### **3. Prime Minister’s Questions**

OPQ data include those questions asked of the Prime Minister. PMQ data are reported separately in the tables. Readers wishing to identify the number of OPQs asked by one particular Member, but excluding those questions asked of the Prime Minister, should subtract the relevant number of PMQs from the total number of OPQs.

### **4. Private Notice Questions/Urgent Questions**

The data in this paper do not report Private Notice Questions (PNQs). These are now known as Urgent Questions (UQs) with effect from the start of the current Session (2002-03). The weekly Business Statement by the Leader of the House is usually given in reply to a UQ. Urgent Questions data will be reported in future editions of this paper.

## C. Debate Contributions

Data relating to debate contributions include interventions and points of order, as well as full speeches. MPs can make a number of such contributions during a debate. *POLIS* indexing conventions mean that only eight contributions may be incorporated into a single indexed record. Should a Member exceed eight contributions in a debate, there will be two (or more) indexed records relating to their contributions in that particular debate.

For example, where a Member makes three interventions, two points of order and a full speech during a debate (total: 8 contributions), one *POLIS* record will have been created and the corresponding data in the tables will report “1”. Should a Member make five interventions, three points of order and a full speech during a debate (total: 9 contributions), two *POLIS* records will be created and the corresponding data in the tables will report “2”.

## D. Divisions

The table in Part III reports the number of Commons divisions in which each Member participated *as a proportion* (percentage) of all divisions held during the Session. As with parliamentary questions and debate contributions, the Speaker and his three deputies do not normally vote. Their names are not included in the tables.

Members are reported as having participated in a division if they voted either “Aye” or “No”, or acted as “tellers”. Participation rates for newly-elected MPs refer to the period since their date of introduction. No allowance is made for other periods of ineligibility, such as suspension from the House. Members are counted as non-participants during periods of suspension. All data relating to divisions are gathered from uncorrected daily *Hansard*, published on the Parliamentary website.<sup>3</sup> Participation rates can be affected by a number of factors. These may include:

- Abstentions: there is no provision in the House of Commons for a formal abstention, so a Member not wishing to vote either for or against a motion is simply recorded as not voting. Parties may decide to have a *whipped abstention* on certain divisions.
- Ministerial or Opposition front-bench duties.
- Visits abroad as part of a Parliamentary or Committee delegation.
- Constituency business or party duties.
- Pairing: MPs who are ‘paired’ have agreed with their pair not to vote, even if they are present within the precincts of the House.
- Personal circumstances such as illness, bereavements, maternity/paternity leave.

- MPs in certain posts do not usually vote, for example, the Speaker and his deputies. By long standing convention, a Member who has chaired a Standing Committee on a Bill takes no further part in any proceedings relating to that Bill.

When using data in this paper, readers should note that MPs are subject to the whipping system. This system identifies the divisions at which each party believes voting is mandatory. Some divisions are regarded by the parties as less important, and participation tends to be lower. The categorisation of divisions in this way is not made public.

There were 367 divisions during the 2001-02 Session. Further information relating to Commons divisions is available in the House of Commons Information Office Factsheet P9, also available on line.<sup>4</sup>

## II Parliamentary Questions and Debate Contributions

### A. The cost of answering Parliamentary Questions

The costs associated with answering parliamentary questions are usually outlined in the form of an answer to a regular written parliamentary question to the Chancellor of the Exchequer. The latest figures were given on 11 April 2002:<sup>5</sup>

**Barbara Follett:** To ask the Chancellor of the Exchequer what his estimate is of the cost of answering (a) a written parliamentary question and (b) an oral parliamentary question. [49258]

**Mr. Boateng:** As at April 2001, the average cost of answering a written parliamentary question and an oral parliamentary question was £129 and £299 respectively.

WPQs are also subject to an advisory cost limit. Where the cost associated with answering a WPQ exceeds this limit, the answering department can decline to answer by responding to the Member that the information requested can only be provided at “disproportionate cost”. The advisory cost limit was raised to £600 with effect from 11 April 2002.<sup>6</sup>

**Barbara Follett:** To ask the Chancellor of the Exchequer what plans he has to raise the advisory cost limit of £550 for answering written parliamentary questions; and if he will make a statement. [49257]

**Ruth Kelly:** The advisory cost limit was last increased in 2000, *Official Record*, 15 May 2000, column 47W and is to be further increased to £600 from today. The purpose and application of the advisory cost limit remains unchanged. It is intended to act as a threshold for disproportionate cost parliamentary questions (PQs). Any written PQ where the marginal cost of preparing the answer is considered likely to exceed the threshold may be refused in whole or in part on the grounds of disproportionate cost. Alternatively the Minister may decide that the PQ is to be answered irrespective of cost. There is no advisory limit for oral PQs. The advisory limit continues to be based on eight times the average marginal cost for written PQs, which is now £75, rounded down to the nearest £50 for convenience of application.

### C. Parliamentary Questions and Debate Contributions: Analysis by Party

Tables 3 and 4 below provide statistics of parliamentary questions and debate contributions by party, as well as averages per Member.

As discussed earlier, the number of questions asked and debate contributions made may be affected by whether or not the Member concerned has served, or continues to serve, as a Government minister or whip. Government whips do not normally table questions or speak in debates. Parliamentary Private Secretaries typically do not ask questions or speak in debates relating to the department of their respective Minister. The Opposition Chief Whip would not normally table questions or participate in debates, although other Opposition whips are free to do so.

The column marked “*Lab b/b*” provides data for Labour backbenchers only. Data for Government front-benchers who served for all or part of the Session are excluded from back-bench totals.

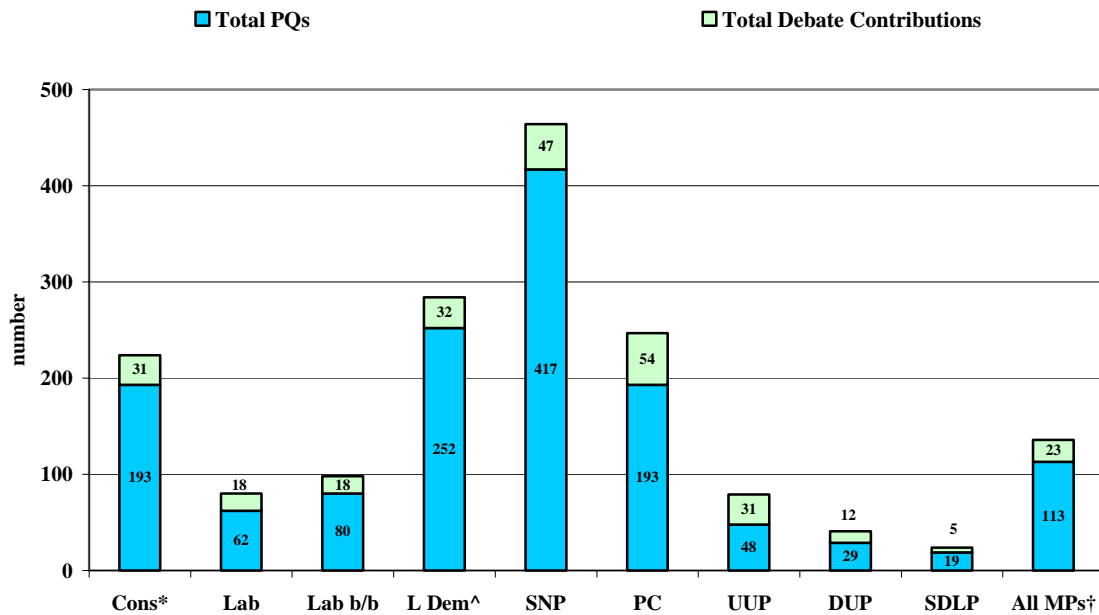
