# London elections 2008

## Elections for Mayor of London and London Assembly: 1 May 2008

Elections for the Mayor of London and members of the London Assembly took place in London on 1 May 2008.

The Conservative candidate, Boris Johnson, was elected as Mayor of London on an increased share of first preference Conservative votes compared to 2004 (+14.1% points). Turnout in the Mayoral election was 44.6 per cent, an increase of 8.7 percentage points compared with 2004.

The composition of the London Assembly changed slightly as a result of the 2008 elections. The Conservatives gained two seats, Labour gained one seat, the Liberal Democrats lost two seats, the Green Party continued to have two seats (no change), and the British National Party won their first seat on the Assembly.

The Conservatives are the largest party in the London Assembly (11 seats), Labour has 8 seats, the Liberal Democrats have three, the Greens have two, and the BNP has one seat.

Turnout in the Assembly elections was 44.5 per cent, an increase of 8.5 percentage points compared with the elections held in 2004.

## Summary of main points

Elections for the Mayor of London and London Assembly were held in London on 1 May 2008. Local authority elections in England and Wales, including elections for some “shadow” unitary authorities, were also held on the same day.

[Library Research Paper 08/48](#) sets out the results of the local elections.

[Library Research Paper 04/48](#) provides data on the previous elections for Mayor of London and the London Assembly, held in June 2004.

Turnout in the 2008 Mayoral and Assembly elections was 44.6 per cent and 44.5 per cent respectively, almost nine percentage points higher than in 2004.

Boris Johnson, the Conservative candidate, was elected as Mayor of London with 53.2 per cent of the vote. Ken Livingstone (Labour), the incumbent, polled 46.8 per cent. Brian Paddick, the Liberal Democrat candidate, was placed third, and the Siân Berry (Green) was fourth.

The Conservatives continue to be the largest party in the London Assembly (11 seats), gaining two seats compared to the 2004 elections. Labour gained one seat (8 seats), the Liberal Democrats lost two seats (3 seats), and the Green Party continue to have 2 seats (no change). With 5.4 per cent of the London-wide ballot vote, 0.4 per cent above the necessary threshold, the British National Party secured one London-wide member on the Assembly, their first ever seat. The UK Independence Party lost both of the London-wide Assembly seats they won in 2004.

# I Mayor of London

## A. Summary

The Mayor of London is elected by the Supplementary Vote System (SV). Under the SV system, voters mark the ballot paper with their first and second choices of candidates. This is done by placing an “X” - as is usual in other elections - rather than by numbering the list of candidates in their order of preference. Electors are not required to make two choices if they do not wish to.

The counting of ballot papers is simple. Voters’ first preferences are counted and if one candidate receives 50 per cent of the vote or more they are elected. If no candidate receives 50 per cent of first preference votes, all remaining candidates, with the exception of the two candidates who received the highest number of votes, are eliminated. The second preference votes on the ballot papers of those eliminated candidates are then examined. Any second preference votes cast for the two remaining candidates are distributed accordingly. The candidate with the most votes at the end of this process is declared elected. Ballot papers where the first and second preference votes are for the top two candidates and not re-used, and the second preference votes are not redistributed to the leading two candidates. In 2008, 300,924 votes were not re-used. A similar proportion of these voters placed the Conservative candidate Boris Johnson first and Labour’s Ken Livingstone second as placed Ken Livingstone first and Boris Johnson second.

The accompanying tables in this section detail the number of first and second preference votes for each of the candidates in the 2008 Mayoral elections. The second preferences of all but the leading two first preference candidates were redistributed to Boris Johnson (Conservative) and the incumbent Mayor Ken Livingstone (Labour). As a result, Boris Johnson polled 1,168,738 votes (53.2 per cent) and was elected as Mayor of London compared to Ken Livingstone’s overall vote total of 1,028,966 (46.8 per cent).

Although Livingstone received more votes than in 2004 (+208,336 first preference votes and +52,681 second preference votes), his final vote share fell by 8.6 percentage points overall. Livingstone received relatively high shares of first preference votes in City and East (52.0 per cent) and North East (49.4 per cent) but polled less than 30 per cent of first preference votes in West Central (29.0 per cent), Croydon and Sutton (28.8 per cent, Havering and Redbridge (27.8 per cent), and Bexley and Bromley (20.3 per cent).

The Conservative candidate, Boris Johnson, polled 1,043,761 first preference votes (43.2 per cent) and 257,792 second preference votes (12.9 per cent). The Conservatives’ first preference vote share rose by 14.1 percentage points compared to 2004 but fell by 1.1 percentage points in the second preference contest. Johnson secured particularly high first preference vote shares in Bexley and Bromley (60.8 per cent), West Central (55.6 per cent), and Havering and Redbridge (52.8 per cent) but polled less favourably in North East (29.4 per cent), Lambeth and Southwark (29.1 per cent), and City and East (27.2 per cent).

The Labour and Conservative candidates secured 80.2 per cent of first preference votes overall, compared to 65.9 per cent in 2004.

The Liberal Democrat candidate, Brian Paddick, was placed third. Paddick polled 236,685 first preference votes, a first preference vote share of 9.8 per cent. The Liberal Democrats polled a further 641,412 second preference votes (32.0 per cent). Paddick's highest share of first preference votes was in South West (13.2 per cent), Lambeth and Southwark (12.5 per cent), and Croydon and Sutton (11.9 per cent). However, in Lambeth and Southwark, the Liberal Democrats' first preference vote share fell by 10.0 per cent compared to 2004. The Liberal Democrats performed less well in West Central (8.4 per cent of first preference votes), Havering and Redbridge (7.3 per cent), and City and East (7.0 per cent). Overall, across London, the Liberal Democrats' first preference vote share fell by 5.5 percentage points compared to 2004, although their second preference vote share rose by 2.7 per cent.

Siân Berry, the Green candidate, was placed fourth in the Mayoral race. Berry polled 77,374 first preference votes (3.2%) and 331,727 second preference votes (16.6 per cent). Compared to 2004, the Greens increased their first preference vote share by just 0.1 percentage points, although their second preference vote share rose by 3.4 percentage points. Berry performed best in North East (5.0 per cent of first preference votes) and Lambeth and Southwark (4.4 per cent) but less well in Bexley and Bromley and Havering and Redbridge (1.9 and 1.8 per cent respectively). In all constituencies, the Greens' first preference vote share either rose or fell by less than one percentage point compared to 2004, although in five constituencies (Barnet and Camden, City and East, Greenwich and Lewisham, Lambeth and Southwark, and West Central), Berry increased the Greens' second preference vote share by more than four percentage points compared to 2004.

The British National Party again fielded a candidate in the Mayoral contest. Richard Barnbrook was the party's candidate. Barnbrook polled 69,710 first preference votes (2.9 per cent) and 128,509 second preference votes (6.4 per cent). Compared to 2004, the BNP's first preference vote remained largely unchanged, falling by 0.2 percentage points compared to 2004, although their second preference vote rose by two percentage points. Barnbrook secured 10,214 first preference votes in City and East (5.6 per cent), 9,583 first preference votes in Havering and Redbridge (5.8 per cent), and 8,950 votes (4.5 per cent) in Bexley and Bromley. The BNP fared less well in Barnet and Camden (1.6 per cent of first preference votes), Lambeth and Southwark (1.5 per cent) and West Central (1.1 per cent). Barnbrook was subsequently elected to the London Assembly in the London-wide Assembly member election.

A number of other candidates stood in the 2008 Mayoral race. The Christian People's Alliance candidate, Alan Craig, came sixth with 1.6 per cent of first preference votes, followed by Gerard Batten (UK Independence Party), Lindsey German (Left List), and Matt O'Connor (English Democrats). The independent candidate, Winston McKenzie polled 5,389 first preference votes (0.2 per cent).

The second preference votes for candidates who were eliminated after the first round are redistributed. A total of 2,004,078 valid second preference votes were cast, of which the most (72 per cent) were cast for eliminated candidates. However, 260,066 second preference votes (13 per cent) were redistributed either to Boris Johnson or Ken Livingstone. Slightly more second preference votes were redistributed to Ken Livingstone than to Boris Johnson. (135,089 and 124,977 votes respectively). 300,924 second preference votes (15 per cent) were not re-used because voters cast a first and second



preference for both leading candidates. Of these, more voters cast a second preference vote for Ken Livingstone having voted for Boris Johnson as first preference (168,109 votes) than voted for Ken Livingstone as first preference and Boris Johnson as second preference (132,815 votes).

Turnout in the Mayoral election was 44.6 per cent, an increase of almost nine percentage points compared with the election held in 2004. Turnout was relatively high in Bexley and Bromley (49.3 per cent), Croydon and Sutton (48.4 per cent), and West Central (47.9 per cent), but lower than average in Greenwich and Lewisham (42.4 per cent), Lambeth and Southwark (41.5 per cent), and City and East (38.8 per cent).

The votes cast for each of the Mayoral candidates in the 14 London Assembly areas are detailed in the following tables. Results are shown by both constituency and the party of each candidate. A summary table is provided immediately below:

\* 132,815 electors voted for Ken Livingstone as 1st preference and for Boris Johnson as 2nd preference, and their 2nd preference votes were not counted

\* 168,109 electors voted for Boris Johnson as 1st preference and for Ken Livingstone as 2nd preference, and their 2nd preference votes were not counted

\* 260,066 2nd preference votes of candidates eliminated after the first round were counted in the redistribution to the top 2 leading candidates

\* 124,977 electors voted for a candidate eliminated after the counting of 1st preference votes and for Boris Johnson as their 2nd preference

\* 135,089 electors voted for a candidate eliminated after the counting of 1st preference votes and for Ken Livingstone as their 2nd preference

**Rejected votes** refers to ballot papers where the vote has not been counted because the ballot paper has not been filled out correctly.

This may be because the voter marked more than one preference in one column, because the voter identified themselves on the ballot paper, if the voter's intention was unclear, or if the voter spoiled their paper in any way.

**Blank votes** refers to ballot papers where no 1st choice and no 2nd choice have been marked, and no vote has been counted

**No 2nd preference** refers to ballot papers where voters have only made 1st choice vote and no 2nd choice vote. The first choice vote has been counted

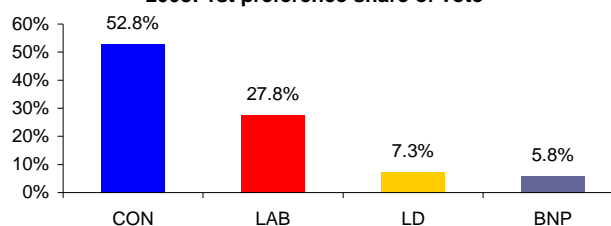

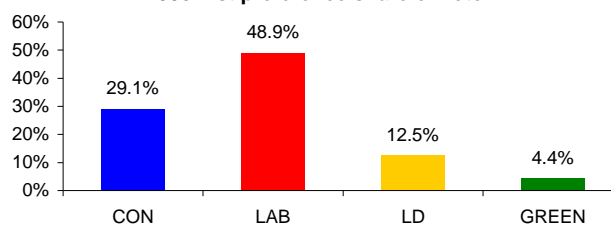

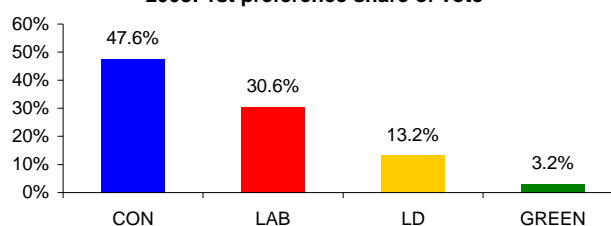

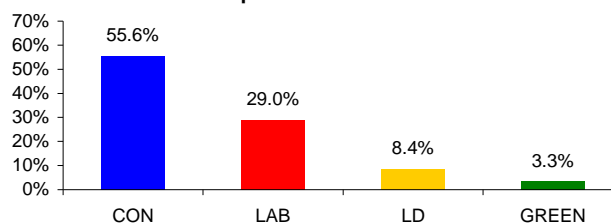

## **II Greater London Authority**

### **A. Summary**

Members of the London Assembly are elected by the Additional Member System (AMS), the electoral system also used for elections to the Scottish Parliament and National Assembly for Wales. Under the AMS system, electors have two votes. The first vote is used to elect a member for the constituency in which the voter is registered, and the second vote is cast for a party (or independent) candidate on a London-wide list.

Voters choose one member for their constituency using the first-past-the-post system. 14 London Assembly constituency members are elected in this way. The second vote is cast for a political party (or independent candidate) to elect the 11 London-wide Assembly members. These seats are allocated to ensure the overall distribution of seats in the Assembly reflects the proportion of votes cast for each party or independent candidate. In the case of party (or independent) votes, the successful candidates are drawn, in order, from the party lists which are available to voters for inspection before the election.

The AMS system produces an Assembly where more than one-half the members are elected to represent single member constituencies, and where each party's share of London Assembly seats better reflects its overall share of the vote. This method aims to ensure that there are Assembly members with whom the electorate can identify on a geographical basis but, overall, the outcome is broadly proportional to the shares of the vote for parties and independent candidates.

Labour gained one seat (Brent and Harrow) in the 2008 Assembly elections and retained two London-wide ("top-up") seats, increasing their seat total from seven to eight. The Conservatives gained three top-up seats but lost the constituency of Brent and Harrow, meaning they made a net gain of two seats overall, taking their seat total from nine to 11. As a result, the Conservatives continued as the largest party in the Assembly, albeit without an overall majority.

The Liberal Democrats lost two top-up seats, reducing their seat total from five to three. The Greens retained two top-up seats. The British National Party won their first top-up seat – the BNP polled 0.4 per cent above the five per cent threshold necessary to be eligible for a seat on the Assembly.

Of the 25 Assembly members elected, eight are women, three fewer women than after the 2004 elections. The Conservatives have one female member, Labour has four, the Liberal Democrats have two, and the Greens have one.

The Conservatives' share of the vote in the London Assembly constituency elections was 37.4 per cent, an increase of 5.9 percentage points compared to 2004. Eight Conservative constituency members of the London Assembly were elected. The party fared particularly well in West Central (53.4 per cent), Bexley and Bromley (52.6 per cent), and Havering and Redbridge (47.7 per cent), but their performance was much weaker in City and East (17.5 per cent), Lambeth and Southwark (20.1 per cent), and North East (23.3 per cent). The Conservatives made particularly significant gains compared to 2004 in Havering and Redbridge (+13.1 percentage points), Bexley and Bromley (+12.2% points), and Ealing and Hillingdon (+10.7% points). Their vote share in City and East fell by 0.7 percentage points. The Conservatives polled 34.6 per cent in the London-wide (top-up) ballot, and three Conservative London-wide members were elected to the Assembly.

Labour's share of the vote in the constituency elections across London was 28.0 per cent, down by 3.2 percentage points compared to the elections held in 2004. Six Labour constituency members of the London Assembly were elected. The party gained the constituency of Brent and Harrow from the Conservatives. The Labour vote share was relatively strong in North East (37.9 per cent), Brent and Harrow (37.3 per cent), and Lambeth and Southwark (37.2 per cent). Labour's vote was much lower in Bexley and Bromley (15.0 per cent), South West (16.0 per cent), and Croydon and Sutton (19.5 per cent). Labour made significant gains compared to 2004 in North East (+8.9 percentage points) and Brent and Harrow (+7.3% points), but their vote share fell by one percentage point in South West. Labour polled 27.6 per cent in the London-wide (top-up) ballot and two London-wide members were elected.

The Liberal Democrats' share of the vote in the constituency elections was 13.7 per cent, down by 4.9 percentage points compared to 2004. The party's vote share varied considerably across the London constituencies. Their share of the vote was highest in South West (26.5 per cent), Lambeth and Southwark (22.7 per cent), and Croydon and Sutton (18.6 per cent). The party fared worse in West Central (9.8 per cent), Havering and Redbridge (7.6 per cent), and City and East (7.5 per cent). In all 14 constituencies, the Liberal Democrats performance in terms of share of the constituency vote was lower than in 2004, notably in Bexley and Bromley (-8.2 percentage points), City and East (-6.5% points), and Ealing and Hillingdon (-6.4% points). The Liberal Democrats polled 11.4 per cent in the London-wide (top-up) ballot. Three London-wide Liberal Democrat Assembly members were returned – a net loss of two seats compared to 2004.

The Green Party's vote share across London in the constituency elections was 8.1 per cent. Their vote share increased by 0.3 percentage points compared to 2004. Like the Liberal Democrats, the party's vote share varied quite markedly. They polled particularly well in North East (13.3 per cent), Lambeth and Southwark (11.0 per cent), and Greenwich and Lewisham (10.6 per cent), but less favourably in Bexley and Bromley (4.6 per cent), Croydon and Sutton (5.2 per cent), and Havering and Redbridge (5.5 per cent). In all but three London constituencies, the Greens' share of the vote increased compared to 2004, albeit by less than one percentage point. Their vote share fell by one percentage point in Enfield and Haringey. The Greens polled 8.4 per cent in the London-wide (top-up) ballot, and they retained two London-wide (top-up) members on the Assembly.

The British National Party fielded one candidate in the constituency ballot, Robert Bailey in City and East. Bailey secured 0.7 per cent of the vote in that constituency. In the London-wide member ballot, the BNP polled 5.4 per cent of the vote. Richard Barnbrook was elected as a London-wide (top-up) member of the Assembly, and became the first ever BNP candidate elected to the London Assembly. The BNP's vote share in the London-wide ballot was particularly strong in Havering and Redbridge (11.5 per cent), City and East (9.9 per cent) and Bexley and Bromley (8.9 per cent), but weakest in West Central (2.4 per cent) and Barnet and Camden (2.9 per cent). In Havering and Redbridge, the party's vote share rose by 3.4 percentage points compared to 2004, although in Enfield and Haringey the BNP vote fell by 0.6 percentage points.

The National Front fielded candidates in five London Assembly constituencies. In Greenwich and Lewisham, the NF secured 5.8 per cent of the vote alongside 5.6 per



cent in Bexley and Bromley. The party did not stand in the London-wide (top-up) ballot. No National Front candidates were elected as members of the London Assembly.

The UK Independence Party secured 3.0 per cent of the vote in the constituency ballot and 1.9 per cent in the London-wide (top-up) election. In 2004, two UKIP members were elected to the Assembly in the London-wide ballot; the party lost both seats in the 2008 elections.

The English Democrats polled 1.5 per cent in the constituency ballot and 1.1 per cent in the London-wide (top-up) election. Left List polled 1.4 per cent and 0.9 per cent respectively. George Galloway's Respect party polled 2.5 per cent in the London-wide election and Unity for Peace and Socialism polled 0.3 per cent, also in the top-up ballot. The Christian People's Alliance (standing as "Christian Choice") fielded candidates in all 14 London constituencies and also stood in the London-wide election. The CPA secured 2.7 per cent of the vote in the constituency ballot and 2.9 per cent in the London-wide (top-up) ballot.

Abolish the Congestion Charge polled 2.6 per cent of the vote in the London-wide (top-up) election, its highest vote share was recorded in West Central where the Congestion Charge currently operates – 4.1 per cent. Damian Hockney's One London party polled 0.1 per cent of the vote in the London-wide ballot.

Free England, Animals Count, Socialist Alternative, and the Socialist Party each polled 0.1 per cent of the vote in the constituency ballot. The Independents polled 0.2 per cent in the London-wide election, and Veritas polled just 510 votes in Barnet and Camden in the constituency ballot.

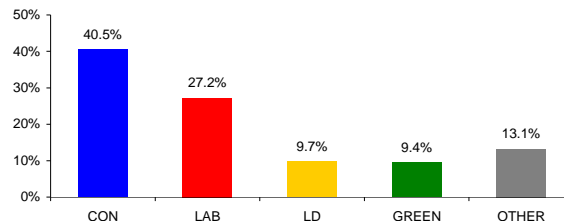

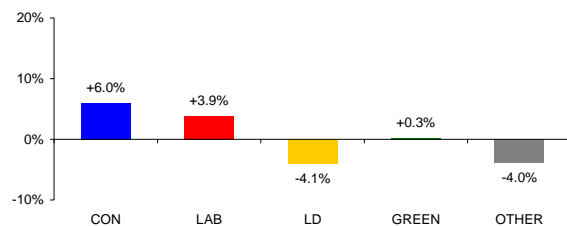
2008 Constituency member % vote



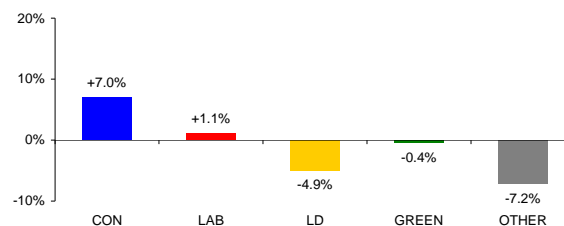
2008 London-wide member % vote

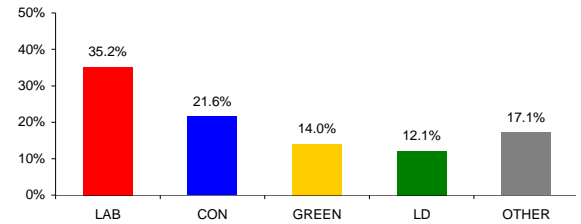

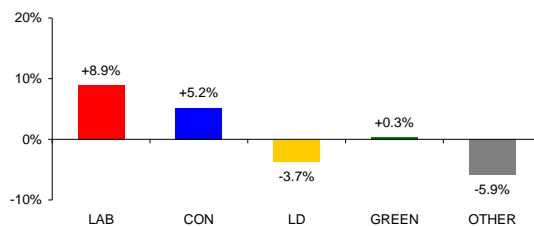

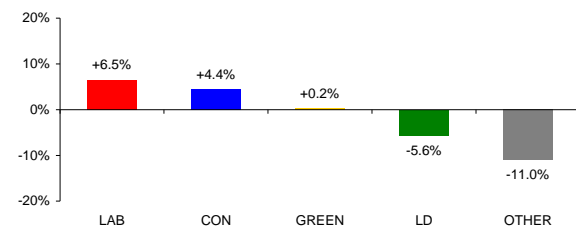

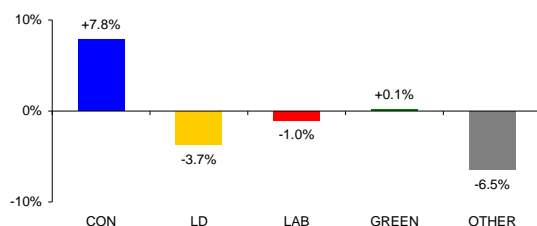

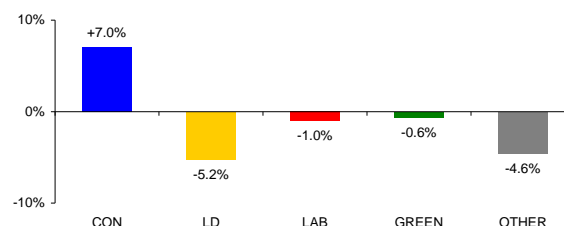
2008 London-wide member % vote

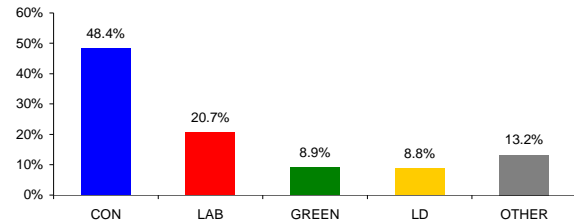

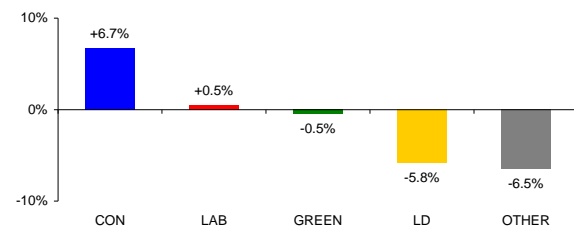
