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By-elections since the 1997 general election

This paper gives the results of by-elections held since the 1997 general election. It replaces Research Paper 97/123.

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Notes: 'turnout' is calculated as the number of valid votes cast (excludes spoilt ballots) as a percentage of the electorate.

'swing' is defined as the average of one party's gain and another's loss in the share of the vote between the 1997 general election and the by- election.

Key: * indicates a lost deposit (the threshold below which a deposit is lost was reduced from 12½ per cent to 5 per cent of the total votes cast from 10 October 1985)

+ indicates a woman candidate
