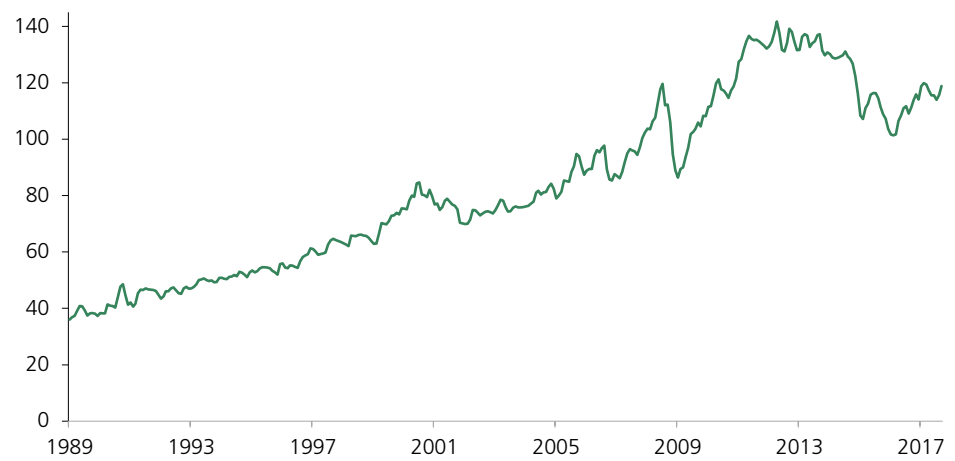


ROAD FUEL PRICES (UK)

- Petrol and diesel prices increased sharply between 2009 and 2011 before levelling off. They dropped between 2014 and 2015, but have risen over the course of 2016 and 2017.
- Unleaded petrol cost an average of 118.9p/litre in September 2017. This was an increase of 7% compared to the same time in 2016.
- In September 2017, the average diesel price was 120.6p/litre, a 6% increase from a year earlier.
- Based on 30 October 2017, fuel prices the UK had the twelfth-highest pump price for petrol and the highest diesel price in the EU.
- 66% of the UK's unleaded petrol pump price was accounted for by taxes and duties; the second highest proportion in the EU
- 68% of the UK's diesel pump price was accounted for by taxes and duties; the highest proportion in the EU.
- Excluding tax and duties, the September 2017 prices for unleaded petrol and diesel were 41.2p/litre and 44.3p/litre respectively.
