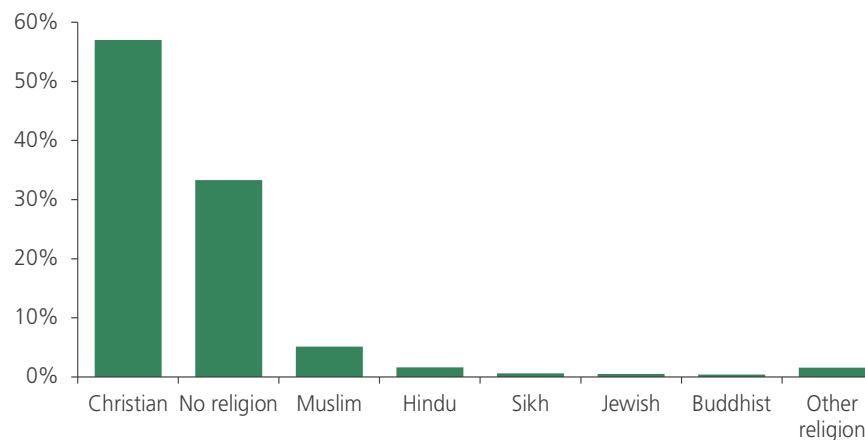


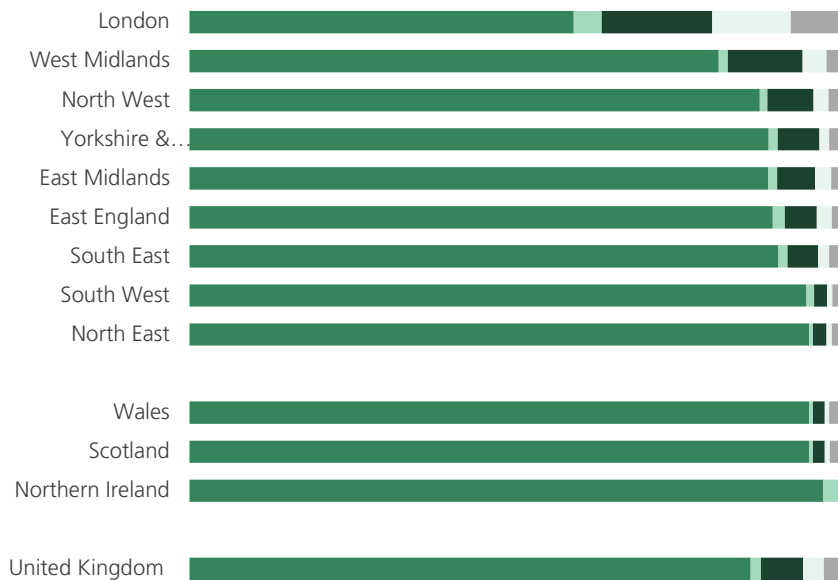
## ETHNICITY AND RELIGION, UK

- In 2016, 86.3% of the UK population was in the White ethnic group. The next largest ethnic group was the Asian or Asian British group (6.5%), followed by the Black or Black British group (3.2%).
- Among the regions of England, London had the largest proportion of people in non-White ethnic groups (40.9%) and the North East the smallest proportion (4.7%). Wales (4.7%), Scotland (4.7%), and Northern Ireland (2.5%) all had relatively few people in non-White ethnic groups.
- In 2015, 57.0% of the population of Great Britain described themselves as Christian, 33.3% said they had no religion, 5.1% were Muslim, and 1.6% were Hindu.
