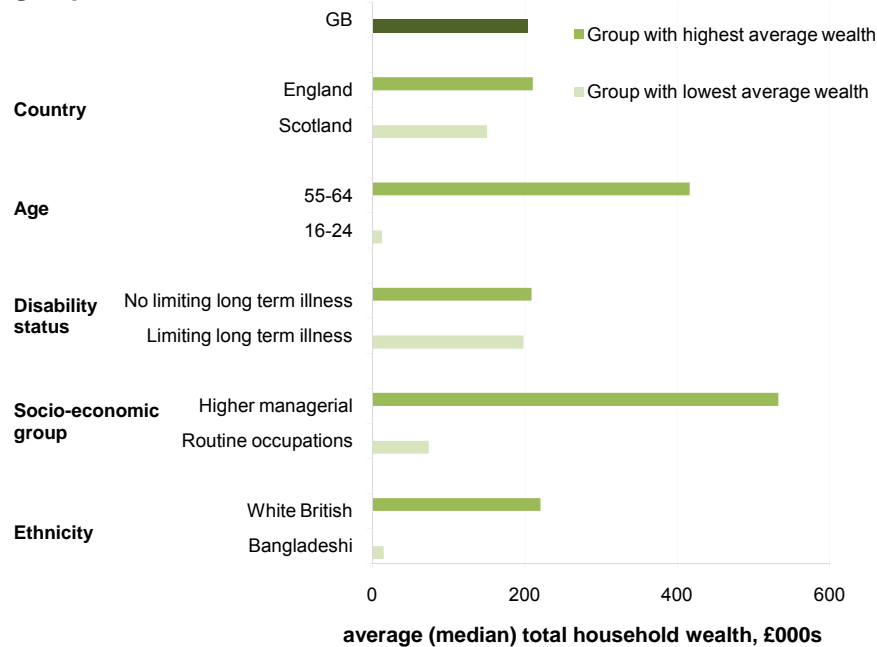


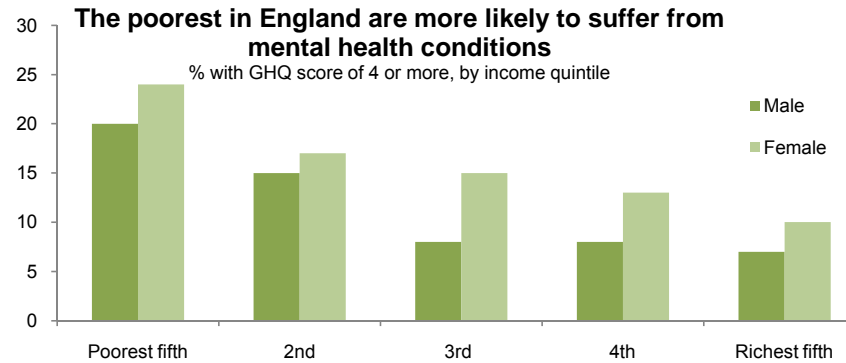
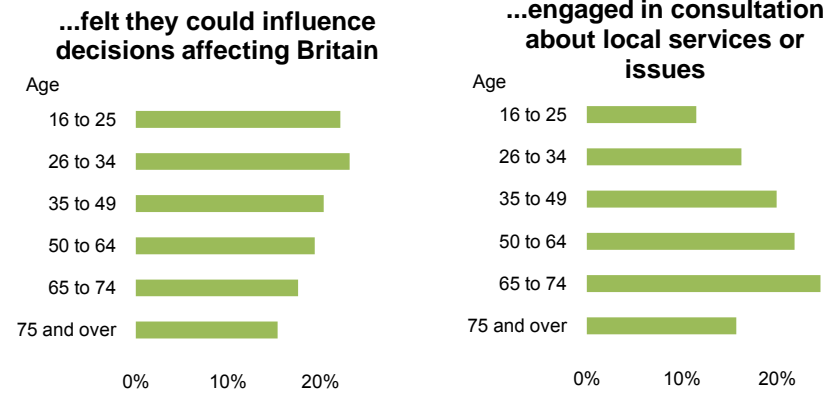
## VI How fair is Britain?

- The Equality and Human Rights Commission is required to report to Parliament every three years on the progress that is being made towards a society at ease with its diversity, where individuals have the opportunity to achieve their potential and treat each other with dignity and respect.
- The first such triennial review - *How fair is Britain?* - a 700-page volume, was published on 11 October 2010 and is available online: <http://www.equalityhumanrights.com/key-projects/triennial-review/>
- The review analyses data to consider how the experiences of different groups of people vary across different categories. Groups that are considered include age, gender, disability and sexual orientation. The report explores, among other areas, security, education, standard of living and power and voice.
- The following charts are provided to give a flavour of the wide range of information that is contained in the report.
