Increasingly, key data sources are available online. Links to relevant websites and publications are contained within the text of this Note, with footnotes detailing the web addresses for hard copy readers. As far as possible links lead to parent web pages, from which the user can choose the specific report they require. In some instances, however, the link leads directly to the document in question.

A. Introduction

The majority of statistical work in Northern Ireland is the responsibility of the chief executive of the Northern Ireland Research and Statistics Agency (NISRA). Responsibility for statistical outputs in relation to policy areas which are devolved rests with Ministers in the Northern Ireland Assembly. The Secretary of State for Northern Ireland is responsible for National Statistics produced by the Northern Ireland Office (NIO).

While statisticians working in Northern Ireland are not formally part of the Government Statistical Service, NISRA, NIO, and the Northern Ireland Departments work closely with the Office for National Statistics (ONS) to ensure that common standards apply to the production of statistics throughout the UK. ONS publish [Regional Trends](#)¹, which features statistical and analytical comparisons of key social and economic countries and regions of the UK.

The *Memorandum of Understanding* between the UK Government and the devolved administrations, published in 2001, included an appended [Concordat on Statistics](#)² setting out the arrangements for UK statistical work. The concordat aims to ensure that the devolved administrations promote comparable statistics across the UK and maintain statistics required to be submitted on a UK basis to the EU and international bodies.

The [Northern Ireland Abstract of Statistics](#)³ is the most comprehensive statistical compendium produced in Northern Ireland. It is compiled by the Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency (NISRA) and contains a wide range of statistics drawn from both government and non-government sources. The tables cover a large number of subject areas including, among others, population, social and welfare, education, crime and justice, the labour market, transport, tourism, agriculture, energy, the environment and the economy.

The Central Survey Unit of NISRA also published details of the [Northern Ireland Continuous Household Survey \(CHU\)](#)⁴. The survey covers a range of topics including household composition, housing, families and children, health, smoking and drinking, environmental issues and sport and leisure.

Northern Ireland is a designated statistical territory in the European Nomenclature of Statistical Territorial Units (NUTS). Consequently statistical information for Northern Ireland is available in the [Eurostat regional year book](#)⁵. The yearbook presents a broad set of regional data on: population, gross domestic product, household accounts, labour market, labour productivity, urban statistics, science, technology and innovation, structural business statistics, transport, tourism, education and agriculture.

B. Agriculture & Forestry

Library Statisticians: Oliver Hawkins (x2324) and Rachael Harker (x5061)

The Northern Ireland [Department of Agriculture and Rural Development statistics page](#)⁶ lists all their relevant statistical publications. The main summary annual volume is the annual [Statistical Review of Northern Ireland Agriculture](#).⁷ Data from the UK wide Agricultural and Horticultural Census is summarised in [The Agricultural Census in Northern Ireland](#).⁸ Time series data is available from 1996.

A comprehensive overview of agricultural statistics is given in [Agriculture in the UK](#).⁹ This includes information for all the home countries on farm incomes, land use, livestock, trade, different commodities, public expenditure and some international comparisons. Two of the other main UK statistical publications are [Farm Business Survey](#)¹⁰ and [Family Food - Report on the Expenditure & Food Survey](#).¹¹

C. Attitudes & Opinions

Library Statisticians: Richard Cracknell (x4632) and Feargal McGuinness (x4310)

The [Northern Ireland Social Attitudes Survey](#)¹² ran from 1989 to 1998 as an extension of the British Social Attitudes (BSA) series. In 1998 it was replaced by the [Northern Ireland Life and Times Survey](#)¹³. These surveys aim to record the attitudes, values and beliefs of the people in Northern Ireland on a wide range of social policy issues. The surveys also provide an opportunity to compare the attitudes of people in Northern Ireland and Britain since some of the questions are also asked in Britain.

Detailed results of the Northern Ireland Life and Times survey are available by the [year of survey](#)¹⁴ or by the [topics covered](#)¹⁵ in a particular questionnaire module. Archived results from the Northern Ireland Social Attitudes survey are also available online at the [CAIN \(Conflict Archive on the Internet\)](#)¹⁶ website at Ulster University.

The CAIN website also has a list of [polls of opinion and attitude in Northern Ireland](#)¹⁷ from 1973 to 2004. The polls listed include those covering general social attitudes as well as political opinion polls regarding likely voting behaviour. The market research company [Millward Brown \(Ulster\)](#)¹⁸ is a major source of political opinion polls for Northern Ireland.

D. Crime & Justice

Library Statistician: Gavin Berman (x3851) and Roderick McGuinness (x3793)

The [Digest of Information on the Northern Ireland Criminal Justice System](#)¹⁹ includes details of recorded crime, perceptions and experiences of crime, prosecutions and sentencing and appeals against convictions. Findings from the [Northern Ireland Crime Survey](#),²⁰ are published annually.

The [Northern Ireland Prison Service](#)²¹ website contains a variety of data on prisons in Northern Ireland, including weekly updated data on population and monthly data on staffing. The site includes details of the number of people released early under the terms of the Good Friday Agreement.

The [Police Service of Northern Ireland](#)²² website contains a variety of data, including [crime statistics](#)²³ and [drug statistics](#)²⁴ by district and area, [road traffic statistics](#)²⁵ and statistics on [police strength](#).²⁶ The annual [Report of the Chief Constable](#)²⁷ includes data on the cost of policing and on police complaints and disciplinary action.

E. Defence

Library Statisticians: Gavin Berman (x3851) and Tom Rutherford (x4313)

The main source of defence statistics is the [Defence Analytical Services Agency](#)²⁸ (DASA), which provides specialist analysis and statistical services to the Ministry of Defence (MoD). DASA's annual compendium, [UK Defence Statistics](#),²⁹ contains a range of tables on Northern Ireland defence statistics

The Library Standard Note on [Defence Expenditure](#),³⁰ collates the key statistics relating to UK defence spending and includes some details on expenditure in Northern Ireland.

F. Economy

Library Statisticians: Dominic Webb (x4324)

The Northern Ireland [Department of Enterprise Trade and Investment](#) (DETI)³¹ website provides an [economic overview](#)³² section. The overview page provides the latest headline figures for:

- Labour Force Survey (LFS) in Northern Ireland
- Employment and unemployment
- Benefit claimant counts
- New deal statistics
- Hours worked and earnings

More detailed data for each of these topics is available from the Department's [Statistics and Economic research](#)³³ web pages. This section of the DETI website includes the annual publication the *Northern Ireland Economic Bulletin*. The website also includes a section on [Economic Briefing](#)³⁴ which links to monthly and quarterly briefings which includes statistics for:

- Gross Domestic Product
- Interest rates
- Inflation rates
- Manufacturing output and productivity
- Employment
- Trade
- Tourism

G. Education

Library Statisticians: Paul Bolton (x6969) and Feargal McGuinness (x4310)

Statistics on education in Northern Ireland are published by the [Statistics and Research Branch](#)³⁵ of the Department of Education. The [Compendium of Northern Ireland Education Statistics](#)³⁶ provides summary information on the numbers and types of schools, numbers of pupils and teachers and participation in further and higher education. The [Statistics on Education](#)³⁷ section of the website provides detailed statistics on teacher numbers, pupil:

teacher ratios, destinations of school leavers, transfer procedure test results, key stage assessments, the participation rate of 16 and 17 year olds in full time education and on the levels of qualifications achieved by pupils at schools in Northern Ireland.

H. Elections

Library Statisticians: Feargal McGuinness (x4310) and Richard Cracknell (x4632)

The Library series of publications on Election statistics include analysis of Northern Ireland results for Westminster parliamentary elections and for elections to the Northern Ireland Assembly.

The Library research paper on the [General Election 2010](#)³⁸ includes analysis of voting in Northern Ireland as does the paper on [Election Statistics: UK 1918-2007](#).³⁹ The UK Election Statistics paper also shows the results of the elections to the Northern Ireland Assembly election in 1998, 2003 and 2007.

The Library has also produced separate Standard notes on the Northern Ireland Assembly Elections [2011](#)⁴⁰ [2007](#)⁴¹ and [2003](#).⁴²

The [Electoral Office of Northern Ireland](#)⁴³ (EONI) publishes detailed statistics on the [Northern Ireland electorate](#),⁴⁴ including:

- Total Electorate - the total number of electors listed on the full Northern Ireland Electoral Register.
- Parliamentary Electorate - the number of electors who are able to vote at Westminster Parliamentary elections.
- Local Government Electorate - the number of electors who are able to vote at Local Government and Northern Ireland Assembly elections.

EONI also publish details of election results for the [election results](#)⁴⁵ for the Northern Ireland Assembly elections, Westminster parliamentary and local government elections and European parliamentary elections. Please note that the EONI turnout ("percentage poll") figures differ to those published in the Library Elections series of research papers as the EONI figures include invalid votes as eligible figures for turnout statistics whereas the Library papers exclude such votes.

The Electoral Commission also gives figures for the [Northern Ireland Assembly elections](#).⁴⁶ As well as the results, it also provides other statistics by constituency such as turnout, proxy votes, postal votes and votes rejected.

I. Energy & Environment

Library Statisticians: Paul Bolton (x6969) and Oliver Hawkins (x2324)

The Northern Ireland Department for Trade and Industry include some key facts about electricity, gas and sustainable energy supply on the [energy](#)⁴⁷ section of their website.

The Automobile Association (AA) publish a regular [fuel price report](#)⁴⁸ which gives current prices for Northern Ireland and links to local data.

Detailed information on renewable energy sources is available from the [Renewable Energy Statistics Database for the UK](#)⁴⁹ (Restats), which has been set up to monitor progress towards achieving the Government's target on renewable energy. It includes UK-wide and regional data. The Restats [planning database](#)⁵⁰ measures installed capacity by type and the amount at various stages of the planning process.

Uptake of household grants from the Low Carbon Buildings Programme in Northern Ireland can be viewed on the [applications statistics](#)⁵¹ site. The statistics section of the [UK Wind Energy Database](#)⁵² gives summary information on the capacity of wind farms in Northern Ireland.

The Northern Ireland [Environment and Heritage Service](#)⁵³ includes summary statistics and publications on a range of topics including:

- [water](#)⁵⁴
- [waste](#)⁵⁵
- [biodiversity](#)⁵⁶
- [landscape](#)⁵⁷
- [the built environment](#)⁵⁸
- [air quality and climate](#)⁵⁹
- [pollution](#)⁶⁰

The [National Atmospheric Emissions Inventory](#)⁶¹ contains very detailed information on estimated pollution by type and source. Statistics can be downloaded for all types of pollutants, including those linked to climate change. The methodology used to produce these estimates is also set out.

J. Health Services & Public Health

Library Statisticians: Rachael Harker (x5061), Matthew Keep (x6789)

Top level data on hospital and family health services for Northern Ireland (and some public health statistics) are contained in chapter 16 of National Statistics' [Annual Abstract of Statistics](#).⁶² The Northern Ireland [Department of Health, Social Services and Public Safety](#)⁶³ provide a range of statistics on their website, including:

The website also includes details of the Northern Ireland [Inequalities Monitoring system](#)⁶⁸ which comprises various indicators which are monitored over time to assess area differences across morbidity, utilisation and access to Health and Social Care services in Northern Ireland.

The Northern Ireland NHS publishes statistics on the take up of [bowel, breast and cervical cancer screening](#)⁶⁹ in Northern Ireland.

K. Housing

Library Statisticians: Rachael Harker (x5061) and Matthew Keep (x6789)

Housing statistics for Northern Ireland are published on the statistics and research section of the [Department for Social Development](#)⁷⁰ website. The annual [Northern Ireland Housing Statistics](#) publication includes:

- Public expenditure on housing
- Housing stock
- Dwelling tenure
- House building
- Social housing
- Mortgage lending and affordability
- House prices

[Quarterly data on house prices](#)⁷¹, including a district council breakdown, are also available on the Department for Social Development website.

Several other organisations produce indications of the direction of house prices for Northern Ireland as a whole. The [Halifax House Price Index](#)⁷² breaks house price data down by region on a monthly basis and dates back to the early 1984. The [Nationwide House Price Index](#)⁷³ is released at about the same time each month and is available, at a quarterly level, back to 1952. The [Land Registry's Residential Property Price Report](#)⁷⁴ (quarterly) provides information on average house prices by property type and area, as well as the volume of sales.

The Department for Communities and Local Government publish a monthly [house price index](#),⁷⁵ based on returns from major mortgage lenders through the Survey of Mortgage Lenders. The publication includes house price indices, house price inflation figures, mix-adjusted average house prices and median house prices for the UK as a whole and for individual Government Office regions (including Northern Ireland).

L. Immigration

Library Statisticians: Oliver Hawkins (x2324) and Tom Rutherford (x4313)

The [Population and Migration](#)⁷⁶ section of the NISRA website includes publications on the net migration into Northern Ireland from Great Britain and the estimated net international migration into Northern Ireland from outside the UK.

The Department for Social Development publishes statistics on [National Insurance Numbers allocated to foreign nationals](#)⁷⁷

The Office for National Statistics publishes data on [international migration](#)⁷⁸ to and from the United Kingdom (UK). Northern Ireland data are included.

M. Labour Market

Library Statistician: Roderick McInnes (x3793)

DETI provides a press release entitled the [Monthly Labour Market Report](#)⁷⁹ provides regular statistics for Northern Ireland. Data provided includes employment and unemployment rates, economic inactivity and working ages. [Constituency level](#)⁸⁰ data is available.

The [Annual Survey of Hours and Earnings \(ASHE\)](#)⁸¹ provides information on hourly, weekly and annual earnings by gender, work patterns, industry and occupation, including public and private sector pay comparisons. They provide headline statistics for Northern Ireland, as well as a breakdown for smaller Northern Ireland geographies; local government districts and parliamentary constituencies.

[Redundancy](#)⁸² data from DETI provides up to date statistics for Northern Irish redundancies by district council and parliamentary constituency, as well as by job sector and travel to work area.

Data on the labour market and claimants are also available in [nomenclature of territorial units for statistics \(NUTS\)](#)⁸³ statistical boundaries determined by the European Union. The data includes an overview of the labour market, employment by classification, training and claimants.

N. Local Government Finance

Library Statisticians: Gavin Berman (x3851) and Matthew Keep (6789)

Local government finance in Northern Ireland is overseen by the [Department for Environment](#).⁸⁴ Details of the local government [general grant](#) and [general grant and district council rates](#)⁸⁵ are available on the Department's website.

Some information on local government expenditure in Northern Ireland is available in chapter 23 of the [Annual Abstract of Statistics](#).⁸⁶

O. Population

Library Statisticians: Oliver Hawkins (x2324) and Tom Rutherford (x4313)

Most key population data for the UK, including separate figures for Northern Ireland, is covered in chapter 15 of the National Statistics [Annual Abstract of Statistics](#).⁸⁷ Time-series population data, both historical and projected, is provided, along with gender, age and geographical breakdowns. Static data is available on the ethnic composition of the population. Detailed births data includes crude birth rates, fertility rates and still-birth rates. Figures are also available for the number of births outside marriage, adoptions and abortions. Death data is split by age and gender. In addition, the figures are analysed by cause. Other data include infant and maternal mortality. Finally, figures for marriage include the number of people married by age, gender and previous marital status; divorce data cover the duration of the marriage, the age of the partners at marriage and divorce, as well as the number of children under 16 involved and the grounds cited for separation.

The latest population statistics are set out in the ONS's [Population Trends](#)⁸⁸

Data from the 2001 Census of Population is available from the General Register Offices for [Northern Ireland](#).⁸⁹ Census data for parliamentary constituencies can be accessed via the [Neighbourhood Statistics](#)⁹⁰ section of the Northern Ireland Statistics and Research Agency.

P. Security Situation in Northern Ireland

Library Statisticians: Gavin Berman (x3851) and Roderick McGuinness (x3793)

The [Police Service of Northern Ireland](#)⁹¹ publishes a range of statistics on the [security situation](#)⁹² in Northern Ireland. Monthly updates are available as well as time series back to the early 1970's on topics such as: security related incidents (shootings, bombings and incendiaries, firearms and explosive finds, deaths and injuries due to the security situation and numbers of people charged with terrorist and serious public order offences.

The [CAIN](#) (Conflict Archive on the Internet) website at Ulster University collates statistics on [deaths due to conflict](#)⁹³ in Northern Ireland and [casualties of paramilitary style attacks](#),⁹⁴ as well as providing other information about the troubles in Northern Ireland.

Q. Social Security & Pensions

Library Statisticians: Roderick McGuinness (x3793) and Tom Rutherford (x4313)

The Northern Ireland [Department for Social Development](#)⁹⁵ publishes a range of statistics on the provision of social security benefits and retirement pensions in Northern Ireland. The annual [Summary Social Security Statistics](#)⁹⁶ provides details of key benefits claimed by the working age population, families with children and persons of pensionable age. The report also highlights annual statistics on the individual benefits claimed. Statistics are given for Northern Ireland as a whole and for individual district council areas.

The website also publishes quarterly data on the individual benefits of:

- [Disability living allowance, attendance allowance and carers allowance](#)⁹⁷
- [Incapacity benefit and severe disablement allowance](#)⁹⁸
- [Income support](#)⁹⁹
- [Jobseekers allowance](#)¹⁰⁰
- [Retirement pension](#)¹⁰¹
- [Pension credit](#)¹⁰²

R. Transport

Library Statisticians: Matthew Keep (x6789), Tom Rutherford (x4313)

The Department for Regional Development produce an annual publication on [Northern Ireland Transport Statistics](#)¹⁰³ which covers statistics on vehicle registrations, driver and vehicle testing, the road network, road freight, road safety, public transport, air transport and general transport statistics. Quarterly [Road and Rail Transport Statistics](#)¹⁰⁴ are also published, along with data from the [Travel Survey for Northern Ireland](#).¹⁰⁵

The Northern Ireland Department for the Environment produce an annual publication the [Northern Ireland Seat Belt Survey](#)¹⁰⁶ which has been carried out annually since 1994 The survey involves observing stationary traffic and recording details of occupants such as gender, estimated age and whether a seat belt or child restraint is being used.

The Police Service of Northern Ireland also publish a range of [road traffic statistics](#)¹⁰⁷.
